Week 1 – Intro into The Augsburg Confession

Background

"The Augsburg Confession is nothing else than Holy Scripture. Anyone who rejects the Augsburg Confession is rejecting Scripture because he is not accepting what the Bible itself says." (C. F. W. Walther, founding father of The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod)

- Before whom are we to confess?
- What is the blessing from making such a confession?
- What happens when we don't ask God?

Read Matthew 16:13-18.

- What is Peter's confession of faith?
- How was Peter able to make such a confession faith?
- On what does Christ build His church?

Read Romans 10:9-10.

- What is the confession of faith that we make?
- What is the result or blessing of continuing in such a confession?

Read 1 Corinthians 12:3.

- What is the confession of faith that we make?
- How are we able to make such a confession of faith?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-4.

- What is the content of the Gospel or confession of faith that we have received?
- What are we to do with the Gospel we have received?

Read 2 Thessalonians 2:13-17.

- What are the "traditions" or "teachings" that Paul is speaking about?
- What are we to do with these "traditions" or "teachings"?

Read 1 Peter 3:15-16.

- What answer or defense are we to give before others?
- How are we able to do this?

Read Jude 3-4.

- What are the problems that Jude addresses?
- What exhortation does he give his readers?

Question 2 – In The Augsburg Confession preface, what are the two reasons that Charles V summoned a meeting at Augsburg (Paragraph 1)

- "The Turk" was a threat to the Holy Roman Empire which made the emperor eager to unite Christians for dealing with the Turk.
- Luther's key points regarding waging war on the Turk
 - "To fight against the Turk is the same as resisting God, who visits our sin upon us with this rod of his anger." [Isaiah 10:5]
 - The Turk has "no right or command" to wage war on us, yet God is using him as the "rod of his anger" against our European Christianity.
 - Since we are now confronting two enemies: both God and the "rod of his anger," the Turk, we must be clear just who is authorized to fight in this war and how. To this question the answer is: "two and only two: one is named Christian, the other Emperor Charles." (Luther's Works, vol 46:157)

Question 3 – Who is "the Turk today and why is it important for a Christian to be grounded in his or her confession of faith when responding to "the Turk" today?
