Rev. Dr Scott Murray – 3rd Vice President for LCMS, Pastor @Memorial Lutheran, Houston, TX Message focus – "Winning by Losing."

 - MT District is not a business enterprise
 - Many congregations have been without a pastor for years, but the Gospel has preserved the message of Christ and what He has done for us.
 - o The power of the Gospel, and not our hands, will craft the future.
 - o The Gospel will always remain the same.
 - 85% of our congregations have fewer than 100 in attendance, and around 50% have fewer than 50 on any given Sunday.
 - Many pastors serve in multi-congregational roles, and at least 6 are using technology to deliver services. (Minus the Lord's Supper.)
 - It is the desire of the district to keep all congregations open no matter how small.
 - Added a congregation in Challis ID. MT District now has congregations in ND, ID and looking at Canada next. (not really)

Set Apart to Serve Initiative

- There is a great need for Pastors, Teacher's, and church workers and we need to care for our church workers.
- Recruitment of you to serve in the ministry happens at the home congregations when they
 provide a culture to serve
 - Involve the children in the Word and Sacrament
 - Nurture and encourage youth in genuine relationships
 - Provide opportunities for youth to serve
 - Supporting our youth to participate in like-minded community events
 - Encourage youth in vocational discussion
- Timothy's grandmother and mother were involved in his education and vocational calling. (I Timothy and II Timothy)
- Congregations with very few youth members or no youth members can support the program.
 - Congregations are asked to pray for the Lord of the harvest to send out church workers
 - Pray for the Pastor and care for them
 - Participate in the District "Set Apart to Serve" program
 - Support the seminaries and church work programs at Concordia University's.
 - Encourage and support grandkids, relatives and friends to pursue church work.
 - Consider sending a gift to the "Set Apart to Serve" (SAS) Program to build for the future.

Synodical President Presentation – Rev Dr Matthew Harrison, President LC-MS

- o The 500th Anniversary of the Augsburg Confession is in 2030
- o Currently 35 districts that make up the LC-MS.
- o Try reading the Bible from 1 perspective each year.
- "We are Book of Concord Lutherans" We live by the creeds and the articles contained within the Book of Concord.
- o When we get tied up in non-scriptural issues, the message of the Gospel gets set aside.
- o President Harrison then went over several articles in the Augsburg Confession
 - Article I God. We have three creeds in which we acknowledge who God is, what he
 does and his desire for our salvation. They are unchanged since Christ
 - Article II Man. Original sin makes us blind
 - Article III Who is Christ. His blood, "Divine Blood" cleanses us and covers our sin.
 - Article IV Justification. We do not acquire it by our work. We are justified by grace through faith. Christ is the context of our faith.
 - Article V Office of the Ministry. God instituted the ministry to present the Gospel and Sacraments. The office has functions. Forgiveness can be given by anyone.
 - Article VI New Obedience. Faith will bring forth good works. If you walk on a beach, the footprints from you are behind you, not in front of you.
 - Article VII and VIII— The Church. Let us not despair, we have one Holy Apostolic Church. We preach the Gospel in purity. We (LC-MS) are not the only ones saved, and if anyone is preaching that, it will be grounds for removal. In church God serves you. Gives forgiveness of sin. God doesn't need our good works.

- Article IX and X The Sacraments. The culmination of the Augsburg Confession is Baptism and the Lord's Supper.
 - We better know "what it is and why we are coming to receive it." It is the true Body and true Blood for the forgiveness of sin.
 - If a non-member has examined himself/herself and can answer those two questions, then the Pastor has his Pastoral discretion to serve communion.
 - LC-MS Seminaries do not train stupid Pastors.
 - o 1st Timothy The Pastor is the steward of the Lord's resources.

- Note this resolution only calls for CPH to cease the sale of the LLCACA as it currently exists (With Essays written by non-LCMS Pastors and lay teachers)

Resolution 5-01 – Fail

To Condemn the Stone Choir Podcast

(Delegates reviewed a proposed substitution. The convention felt that this resolution brought more attention to the podcast and that because they were not LCMS members, there is little or no admonishment and call for repentance that can be issued.)

Resolution 5-02 – Passed

To Amend Montana District LCMS Bylaw 2.2.2.2

(Bylaw amended to fall in line with Synodical bylaws and wording)

- Resolution 5-03 Passed
 To Reclaim a Beneficial Understanding of Our Synodical Union
